Course Description

In this new and revised Philosophy of Christian Education series (2023), multimedia segments and engagement activities present a foundation of teaching from an intentionally Christian perspective. Course 1 *Foundations*, the first of three courses in this series, explores key philosophical beliefs from a scriptural perspective and examines their impact on Christian education.

Learning Objective

• By the end of this course, you will be able to develop and articulate a personal philosophy of education informed by a biblical perspective on life and learning.

Course Requirements

- This full-length course requires a pre- and post-assessment, engagement activities, discussion forums, and formative assessments. All activities must be completed to receive credit for this course.
- The post-assessment for this course is an original composition, referred to as an "artifact," that showcases your personality as an educator and demonstrates your understanding of a Christian philosophy of education. Your artifact should meet the requirements detailed in the course rubric, but it may be in any format, such as a written paper, an audio recording, a video, a blog post, an infographic, a slide deck, etc. If you are applying for certification through ACSI, your administrator must review and approve your completed artifact.

Course Structure

This course is delivered entirely online though ACSI's online platform, <u>ACSI PD</u>. A subscription to the platform is required. All the lessons, course materials, and resources are provided through the platform. The course is asynchronous, so learners may advance at their own pace.
